y Dear Lila Daughters,

Wishing you all a very happy festival of lights! This issue has got a bit delayed because of some unforeseen medical issues and the packed schedule of us. It has been a hectic time in LPF. The selection of girls for scholarships for the academic year 2024-2025 was planned to start as that of each year, however some new challenges came up in the working of our beloved Foundation, creating additional workload to decide on how to proceed. Maharashtra Government issued new guidelines to all colleges and universities about admission Process for Professional Courses in Higher Education for all girls. female students from economically backward class (EBC), economically weaker sections (EWS), socially and educationally backward classes (SEBC), and other backward classes (OBC) all these categories will be entitled to 100% reimbursement of tuition and examination fees. This was applicable not only to those seeking new admission for 24-25 but also for all those who have yet to complete their ongoing courses. This resulted in reworking on all our budgets and priorities. Connecting with our partners and reworking the procedures. But now, the things are under control and we have started our selection procedure for the new batch as also the claim processing of the existing batches.

We have added new batch of 292 Lila Juniors this academic year. This being the  $14^{th}$  batch of girls in this project making a total of 3240 girls who have benefited from this program. We had the award function for them

in July 2024. Of these 14 batches, 5 batches have completed their graduation and many have even got excellent jobs and are now independent and taking care of their families. This indeed has been very gratifying for all of us at LPF. Adopting these children when they were 10 or 11 years and now grown up with us and become economically independent.

We now have completed our process for selection of other categories



of students' i.e. graduate engineering, diploma to engineering, science graduates, Post-graduation and graduation in nursing. We are working hard to ensure we complete all the process before the end of the year in all regions including Pune, Wardha, Amravati, Nagpur, Hyderabad and Bangalore.

Our very effective and popular training programs will continue and we will study how to enhance our various programs and make them more relevant to the need of the students. You girls are encouraged to give your suggestions for any special training programs you think will meet the ever-changing environment.

In spite of that we have made an effort to have some enjoyable get-togethers with daughters in mission LPF and mission 2 LPF Whatsapp groups. We also celebrated Dad's 86<sup>th</sup> Birthday. We can organize more such programs, if all of you are willing to participate and volunteer and support the staff to coordinate such events. Staff is getting overloaded with office routine work so we need volunteers for such events. Come forward with your suggestions.

Now to take you to various countries and cities where Dad and me travelled during the period March to September. In April, after Dad's birthday celebration, we left for London, UK. During this visit, we had our friends Michaela and Peter Raussendorf to join us from Germany. We together went to visit the ASHA CENTER at Gloucester, where we have taken 9 batches of LF/ LG for 24 days sustainable leadership training program. Unfortunately, this program came to a stop due to COVID and we have not been able to restart the same due to lack of resources. We than went to Lourdes in France. Following this, we flew to Gothenburg for my Board Meeting and returned home after a very enjoyable visit. We then proceeded to Stockholm to meet our old Alfa Laval and Tetra Pak's friends. We also met one of our LF Zarin Khan in Stockholm together with her husband Wahab and daughter Ayzal. She has a scholarship for doing her post-doctoral research in environment.

In June we took a trip to Norway, Finland, and Estonia. In Norway we visited Oslo, where we met two of our LF, with their families, who have been working there for some years now. 

Thank you, LILA Mom, Dad and LPF family, for being the wind beneath my wings. I hope my story inspires you to spread your wings and soar."



Soy of Fiving Back



hen you do 'it' right, **Social Work** is a feeling that is larger than your own life." — Ogden W. Rogers.

Everyone here in this world can be a giver; you just need a will to do it. Everyone can always help others with what they have and others don't. This quote perfectly suit on our LG Nikita Chodhari (2017)

Coming from a middle class family Nikita always have a question, in future will complete higher education or not. But she got answer from LPF. She received LPF fellowship in year 2017, for completing her diploma of engineering. This fellowship is a turning point of her life. Today she is working at TCS as a system developer.

Nikita started to help visually impaired students during her college time. She is inspired by our beloved momdad and her parents and always wishes that she could do something for our society. In 2018, When she was in college, she saw an Instagram story stating that they needed 4 5 scribes for visually impaired students for their online examination. She went there as a scribe for the first time. She saw those students and their struggles, got inspired by them, and started seeing life from a different perspective. She shared her contact details with the student and asked him to contact her directly if he or his friends needed any help. While helping these students she realized, if "I don't know what would have happened to me if I hadn't been able to hear." "Just because a man lacks the use of his eyes doesn't mean he lacks vision." "There is no better way to thank God for your sight than by giving a helping hand to someone in the dark." "Alone we can do so little, together we can do so much."

After that, she started receiving calls for examination from their friend circle. Other scribes charge students for helping with exams. But she started working as a scribe without any charges. Till 2021, she worked only as a scribe for those students but later she started helping those students with their joining process as well. Those students need a helper for their documentation process for arranging documents, filling offline forms, writing any application, etc. Till today she worked for only a small group of students. But she has a vision to work for more students and also she wants to expand her area of work. While working as a scribe, she got a chance to know



very few schools for visually impaired students, most of them stay away from home since childhood to get an education. She also observed one thing they have more difficulties in their lives, but still they have more willpower and more positivity inside them. They never give up easily on any problem.

Even though they are not able to see they are up to date with the latest technologies. They can use mobile, computers as flexibly as all others can do. They are doing all their daily work on their own. Most female students cook for themselves. From the beginning, they stay away from the house, hence they live life independently. By seeing all these things, she got inspired by them. They are fighting their own battle very bravely; she just wants to make things easier for them. She wants to work on banking exam pattern change for these students, as



these students have studied a different syllabus than normal students, and still, have to solve questions like normal students which is quite difficult for them.

These students have special talents like doing calculations quickly without the help of a calculator, having a sharp memory, etc. She met one student who could do coding. They can travel on their own. They are independent people, but unchanged things like exam patterns for bank exams and many other such things should change for them, but still not changed yet making them dependent on others. She thinks that if we change required things according to their academics or their convenience, then they don't need to depend on anyone for these things and can become truly independent.

She appeals to everyone to come forward to help such students.



Polycystic ovary syndrome is a type in which woman's are out of balance. It can cause problems with your periods





and make it difficult to get pregnant. PCOS also may cause unwanted changes in the way you look. If it isn't treated, over time it can lead to serious health problems, such as diabetes and heart disease. Most women with PCOD grow many small cysts on their ovaries. That is

why it is called polycystic ovary syndrome. The Cysts are not harmful but lead to hormone imbalances.

Early diagnosis and treatment can help control the symptoms and prevent long-term problems. Hormones are chemical messengers that trigger many different processes, including growth and energy production. Often, the job of one hormone is to signal the release of another hormone.

For The ovary doesn't make all the hormones it needs for any of the eggs to fully mature. They may start to grow and accumulate fluid. Instead some may remain as a cysts.

The sex hormones get out of balance.

Since no egg matures or is released ovulation does not occur and the hormone progesterone is not made. Without progesterone woman's menstrual cycle is irregular or absent. Normally, the ovaries make a tiny amount of male sex hormones (androgens). In PCOS, they start making slightly more androgens. This may cause you to stop ovulating, get acne, extra facial hair and body hair.

For example: The body may have a problem using insulin, called insulin resistance. When the body doesn't use insulin well, blood sugar levels go up. Over time, this increases your chance of getting diabetes.

The cause of PCOD is not fully understood, but genetics may be a factor. PCOD seems to run in families, So your chance of having it is higher if other women in your family or have irregular periods or diabetes.

Symptoms are mild initially, following symptoms are most common.

- Thinning hair on the scalp and back.
- Extra hair on the face and body.
- Often women get thicker and darker facial hair
- Weight gain and trouble losing weight
- Acne
- Patches of thickened and dark brown or black skin on neck, arms, breasts and thighs
- Male pattern baldness High cholesterol
- Blood pressure
- Infertility or inability to get pregnant
- Irregular bleeding •

#### Dietary and life style modification tips

- Regular exercise moderate activity, walking •
- Healthy foods and weight control are the key treatments for PC0S.
- What to avoid Dairy, gluten, bread, soya products.
- What to eat Low glycemic food, pear, banana, grapes, green leafy vegetable, fatty fish, lean meats, healthy fats.
- Treatment can reduce unpleasant depression
- **Diabetes** medication
- Quit smoking and drinking.

#### Pre menstrual syndrome





#### Menopause

Menopause can be defined as the state of an absence of menstrual cycle for 12 months. The menopausal transition starts varying menstrual cycle length and ends with the final menstrual period. Pre menopause is a term sometimes used for the time around menopause.

The ovaries are the main source of female hormones,

which control the development of female characteristics such as the breasts, body shape, and body hair. The hormones also regulate the menstrual cycle and pregnancy. Oestrogens also protect the bone. Therefore, a woman can develop osteoporosis (thinning of bone) later in life when her ovaries do not produce adequate oestrogen. Menopause is the time in a woman's life at which she can no longer reproduce.

Symptoms of perimenopause, menopause, and postmenopause vary greatly from woman to woman.

#### However, common symptoms of menopause include:

- Hot flushes
- Mood changes
- Fatigue
- Stress
- Tiredness
- Vaginal dryness and itching
- Crying spells
- Loss of libido
- Loss of concentration
- Ovaries reduce in size
- Lining of uterus atrophies.
- Vagina narrows and vaginal tissue thins
- Loss of subcutaneous fat.
- Breasts droop.
- Age related muscular degeneration
- Cardiovascular disorders

#### Foods to be included

Wheat germ, nuts, egg, olive oil, carrot and beet root juice, fish, drumstick, ragi, dairy products, Vit E, soybean

#### Foods to be Restricted

- Spicy foods like pickles
- Coffee, tea
- Chocolate
- Alcohol drinks
- Refined products

PF feels very proud to share yet another story of my daughter Ms. Kavita Ghoshbiswas. She first wishes to thank Mom Dad and Inspira team for giving her the chance to share her experience of personal and professional journey in the hopes of encouraging other women.



Kavita likes to starts as,

#### About myself

I would describe myself as a person who makes the best effort to give justice to all her roles and responsibilities – both professionally and personally, stay positive and remain strong whatever be the situation. On Professional front, currently, I work as an Engineering Manager with Rockwell Automation – Plex Business Unit (RA Plex as we call it). I have almost 20 years of industry experience. I did my Master of Computer Science from Fergusson College, Pune and joined the industry as an intern from where I have grown to be an Engineering Manager for the last 15 years. I did have a career break and returned to the workforce after a four-year gap. In addition to outlining the circumstances that led to my decision to take a break and my desire to restart, I am also sharing my experiences and struggles.

On Personal front, my better half, Prabindra, is also in the IT industry at a very senior position and we have a very beautiful toddler daughter Navika.

#### Journey before the career break:

I was not an exception to the rule that everyone experiences various struggles in life, both professionally and personally. But I always hold fast to one principle that helps me persevere: Never give up. It's okay if you fall and lay on the ground for a while. Take your time, but then stand up once more. You can only live and survive in that way. And this resilience kept me from crumbling even when I lost my father and was unable to say goodbye to him because I was abroad; when I lost my twin babies after they had spent two months fighting for their lives in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) (who entered our lives after ten years of marriage); nor when, immediately following the terrible loss, I had a tough assignment at work.



### Decision to take a break and later bounce back:

At times, personal priorities make you take a decision that you never imagined. I took a break from my career. And thereafter, God blessed us with a baby girl, who will turn 7 very soon and is my lifeline. And then there was a different life in store, which I also cherish. But it was never very easy, as even though I enjoyed being a full-time

mother and a homemaker, money was never an issue as my spouse supported me, but something within me was feeling left out, incomplete, wanting to do something.

At that point, one of my friends who runs a software company, requested that I send him my resume. I updated my resume and sent it to him, but I later decided that I should also apply elsewhere. It's difficult to get the second inning started. You worry about your ability to re-learn the business, the technology, the type of work that will fall on your plate, and, on top of all that, how you will manage your child and the home front (which is expected from a woman in any Indian family). And I







was going through all of these emotions and struggles during the pandemic, especially since my daughter had only started her schooling. But, as fate would have it, I received a call from Plex, went through the interviews and I received an offer within 10 days.

#### Successful Second Innings at RA Plex

I was blessed to have a wonderful manager from US, who supported me throughout, so that I could excel in my work and manage my personal life too, without any difficulties or guilt. It would be unfair not to mention my incredible team on this journey, many of whom have been with me since the beginning. The camaraderie and cohesiveness in my team is something I am very proud of. I take great pride to say that we have been delivering the complete ERP of the RA-Plex product from Pune since last two years when most of the teams have counterpart US teams for help.
