

(https://www.sac.gov.in/vyom/srtd.jsp) Selection of interns can be done through telephone interviews only. They will ask about the projects you have done and knowledge related to the field etc. It is important to explain the basics of your field.

The waiting period is around 1 to 2 months, it depends on the vacancies After getting selected for this internship it is really difficult for me to live in Ahmedabad for a 6th-month internship, food, culture, people there, many questions stood before me. After all, you are changing the state directly. But my seniors were with me so it





was very easy to learn about the place and the work environment at ISRO. The big problem is that bachelors are not allowed to stay in flats in Ahmedabad. So I was worried about it. But my college friends also opted for this internship so I live with them in a flat in the society. Traveling by bus is getting a bit hectic. But when you decide to do it for your bright future, you definitely decide to do it. It was my dream to work with ISRO and now I am working with them. I am very happy about that.










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


us. This shows how humble and beautiful at heart our mom and Dad are."

After completing her graduation Dipalee worked with multiple companies during her stay in Pune, however during covid she got married. It was very difficult for her as she had to move to Oman with her husband and start a new life in a completely new place. After a few months of her marriage Dipalee travelled to Muscat, Oman for first time alone. It was her first international flight. She shared "The culture and food there is very different to what I am used to in India. However, I met many Indians here and it slowly got interesting. It feels really proud to see Indians working here in all sectors. It took me couple of months to settle and start exploring the places here. I was working from home for my company in India and also searching for job based in Oman. After a long search of 8 months, I got and opportunity and after my Interview I was selected for the job at MBD Trading as a Sales Support Specialist. Since then, I have travelled many places along with my husband. My husband helped me a lot during initial days and guided me to explore



and understand the lifestyle here. Muscat's lifestyle is generally easy going with extremely low levels of problems which makes for an attractive city to bring up a family in. Because Muscat is popular with Westerners, it is well developed with shopping malls, restaurants and bars, so it's easy to maintain a lifestyle you're used to having back home. Indian cuisine has been integrated into the Omani culture and can be frequently found throughout the country. Recently we visited Dubai and had one of the best experiences of my life. My husband likes to drive hence we took our car all the way. As we are vegetarian, we preferred to pack our cool box and have our meals handy all the way. We already had our visa which cost us approximately 8000 per person. We crossed the Oman border, completed our formalities and the process was very smooth. Once we reached the destination we checked into our room and started our way towards Metro."







Dipalee suggests, "One thing I liked most about Dubai is that once you get your Metro passes you can take and route and any metro for the complete duration of pass validity. The routes and maps are so well structured and designed, it was easy for us to find our routes and timings. The train journey is so well constructed that you will be able to see all prime locations like the Museum, Burj Khalifa, Dubai frame from the metro itself. We visited the aquarium, Burj Khalifa and ended our day. The next day we went to Dubai Frame which was around 52AED per person. The experience was thrilling and amazing at the same time. The complete glass structure is so well built. We also visited the gold market there. However, I felt that the food there is too expensive and have very fewer options in affordable range. Last day we planned to visit Palm Jumeirah. The unique island is home to some of Dubai's top luxury resorts and Palm Jumeirah is shaped like a palm tree when viewed from above. It has its separate Metro and route that will take you to Palm Jumeirah. As the train is on higher level as compared to ground you are able to get this beautiful view as an Island through the journey. The place is something that takes the beauty of human, technology and nature altogether."

rom googling LPF scholarship to bagging it, from attending LPF training to conducting a training session at LPF for our sisters, from reading the Inspira to now writing down this article in Inspira volume. Life has come a long way" – says Purva Chindage, LILA girl 2015,



was super excited when asked to share her story for this column. In her words "Life is a journey filled with miracles, adventures, failures, and triumphs. As I pen down my journey, I find myself reminiscing about the good old days!"

Purva is a single child to her parents and has completed her schooling from Talegaon Dabhade, Pune and E& TC Diploma from MSBTE. She has always been keen to start her career as a software engineer but was also worried to handle all her education expenses. She came across LPF scholarship program and applied for the same in 2018 as a direct 2nd year student of BE in E&TC. She wanted her story to reach all our sisters so that she can help them in all possible ways.

"I clearly recall the day afresh! Interviewed by a huge panel of women thriving with their careers and of course mom. On completing my graduation, I was placed in Capgemini through campus. My training was in SAP landscape – which is quite an interesting domain! The training was more of a fun experience – students from all over India crunched in one classroom of Pune Office. Post training, we were informed to move to Mumbai – worst news for a person living at Lonavala side ever – I still cannot cope with Mumbai's humid weather, or ever will! I spent 3 years at Airoli office – it was indeed a learning experience – both professionally and personally as I made new colleagues & ample of new friends. Most



important, learnt the hardships of living alone. I have worked at Cappemini for 5 years now - full tenure with the same client who is a luxury fashion brand. Initially I was an SAP BW developer. I was quite comfortable when I entered the corporate culture - part of the credit truly goes to LPF. We had so many training sessions in IT companies itself - it helped me blend in well. Year 3 of my career my client asked me to take up a new challenge in Data analysis space which compelled me to take it up. The role is surprisingly good and me keeps me on my toes!! I had to learn quite a lot in short span of time to keep up with all the talented people around me." Explains Purva.

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Further she added "I was offered with Information analyst/architect role recently from the same client in London -which brings me to one of the most expensive cities in the world. However, London is a boiling pot of cultures from all over the world – the diversity reflects in every aspect – The food, the art, the fashion, and the architecture. This article would be truly incomplete if I do not mention the notorious London weather – I have experienced Snow, Rain, Wind, Sun within 24 hours – and my mom complains that I have worst mood swings! I was initially provided with an accommodation of 10 days. Absolutely short duration to find a house for my stay within 10 days and work full time. The house hunt was crazy! I think I travelled the almost entire London



during my house hunt. I might have partly memorized the entire London Tube map by now. Anybody who thinks Mumbai Train map is complex please do look at London tube map – super complex. Took me good 6-7 hours to understand all routes. Well, I found a good place with friendly Indians in 7 days.

Life here is quite different than one I had back home. Everything and everyone are always on time. As an Indian I am used to huge kitchen and huge Living rooms – the houses here are quite tiny! Learning to use Induction stove tops it all. I have still not figured out how to cook rice without burning the bottom of my Indian pressure cooker. People are super friendly – they can randomly chat to any person sitting next to them. I





recall on Independence Day I put on a white chikankari Anarkali with Saffron chunni, went all out and topped my attire with jhumkas. I was waiting for my bus to arrive and this European lady was running to catch her bus, she stopped and complemented me howling loudly from far away - "I love your costume Girl". I was so befuddled! Here the traffic rules here are super complex and people follow them sincerely - no body uses a horn ever - at a point I felt the cars here do not have horns at all -I can go on & on with all the Cultural shocks - but that would be an essay. So far, I would say, the best part of London is the vibe – you can unapologetically be YOU, no body judges you. Worst part is the Indian food - yes you cannot get the typical Desi Khana everywhere, it's some funny fusion version. Although I did ask an order to be spicy - they ended up adding raw chills to my Gravy!

Workwise, I am thankfully doing well in all the projects I have been assigned to. It really creates a difference when you physically interact with the people you are working – I think people understand your views better and pay more attention when you physically interact. Online meetings simply cannot make that connection. Though the role here is more tough & challenging I have had a better work life balance in London as compared to back home. I have had quite an amazing career - the one that interests me and makes me want to challenge myself.

So far, I have travelled to quite a few places in UK. Bath gave me Jane Austen vibes, Canterbury had the best cobbled streets, the Brighton beach was the best pebble beach ever, Seven Sisters cliffs were breathtaking, Won't even brag about the Scottish Highlands - so picturesque and peaceful - a treat for Harry Potter and Outlander fans! I am planning my visit to Snowdonia next month. All the travelling has stirred up some photography skills in me.

Today as I pen down my entire journey, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone at LPF who are helping girls achieve their dreams and build in core values of independence and courage! Thankyou Mom and Dad for being our never-ending source of inspiration and for your love and care. To all the Girls out there – remember to be confident and courageous – say yes to all the opportunities that you get – create opportunities if you don't get one! Life is too short to live in "what ifs"

ntroduction

Skin has been detailed to reflect the common inward- wellbeing status and aging. Nourishment and its reflection on skin has continuously been curious point for researchers and doctors all through the centuries around the world. Vitamins, Carotenoids, Tocopherol, Flavonoids and a assortment of plant extracts have been reported to have strong antioxidant properties and



have been broadly utilized within the skin care industry either as topically applied agents or oral supplements in an attempt to draw out

young skin appearance. Like all other organs, indeed skin is persistently recovered in people. It is said that, harmed skin is recovered each 2 weeks and what you eat every day matters a lot.

The skin forms a protective covering over the body, a barrier or shield between the body's internal and

external environments. It protects the body from physical hurt of light (UV beams), warm and cold and

microbial wounds. This with all its specialized subordinates, makes up what is called the integument (Latin a covering), which covers the complete surface of the body.

Anatomy of skin

Skin is made up of three layers of the tissues, i.e. Epidermis, Dermis and Subcutaneous tissue. In expansion, it too has two appendages, i.e. hair, nails and three glands.

Let's discuss about nutrition

1. Vitamin C

Vitamin C is a powerful antioxidant. It helps to reduce oxidative stress to the body and may lower cancer risk. It is also involved in the synthesis of collagen, an important protein for making your skin

supple.

Food sources: Lemon, Citrus fruits like Orange-sweet Lime, Broccoli, Kale, Bell Peppers, Guava, Kiwi, Black Currant, Blueberries, Papaya, Strawberry, Sweet potato etc.

2. Selenium

Selenium is a powerful antioxidant trace mineral that is responsible for maintaining skin firmness and elasticity. This mineral not only prevents acne but also aids in cancer prevention. It promotes absorption of vitamin E.

Food sources: Walnuts, Eggs, Tuna, Liver, Wheat Germ, Onion, Seafood, Whole grains, Brown rice, Chicken, Spinach etc.

3. Vitamin E

Vitamin E is one of the key vitamins for skin health. It is especially effective at preventing certain skin cancers. Because vitamin E is having antioxidant properties, it

helps fight free radicals caused by pollution, smoking, processed foods and sun exposure.

Food sources: Almonds, Eggs, Walnuts, Avocados, Asparagus, Sunflower seeds, Pine nuts, Spinach, Oatmeal, and Olives.

4. Omega-3 Fatty Acids

These essential fatty acids (EFAs) offer healing benefits in various inflammatory conditions such as Eczema. Omega-3s also manage overexposure of cortisol levels, which in turn helps keep skin supple and guard against wrinkle formation, also responsible for skin repair, moisture content and flexibility. Since the body doesn't produce these fatty acids, they must be obtained through your diet.

Food sources: Walnuts, Salmon, Mackerel, Sardines, Flaxseeds, and Chia seeds. You can also supplement with a fish oil pill.

5. Vitamin A + Beta-Carotene

Vitamin A is critical for skin repair and maintenance. If you suffer from flaky or dry skin, it could be a sign you're deficient in vitamin A. Beta-carotene, the precursor to vitamin A, is an antioxidant found in brightly colored foods. This antioxidant helps to reduce free radical damage that occurs due to skin damage caused by sun overexposure.

Food sources: Liver, Asparagus, Peaches, Beet greens, Kale, Spinach, Eggs, Sweet Potato, Cantaloupe and Red peppers.

6. Zinc

Zinc is an important trace mineral that helps repair damaged tissue and heal wounds. If you suffer from

acne, it may be as a result of a Zinc deficiency. Zinc may help prevent acne and regulate the production of oil in the skin.

Foods sources: Poultry, Pumpkin seeds, Ginger, Legumes, Seafood, Mushrooms and whole Grains.

Nutrition for hair:

Hair is beauty! Hair is power! Hair is strength!

Hair is actually an indicative of good health as good as skin.

1. Protein

As hair is made of a protein called Keratin. So enough protein in diet is crucial for making hair strong and healthy. If diet is deficient in protein, hair is likely to become dry, brittle and weak. Extremely low protein diets may result in hair loss.

Food sources: Chicken, Turkey, Fish, Dairy products and Eggs, vegetarian sources such as Legumes, Nuts, certain cereals such as Quinoa.

Iron

Iron is an especially important mineral for hair and Iron deficiency- Anemia is a major cause of hair loss. The hair follicle and root are fed by a nutrient rich blood supply. When Iron levels (serum ferritin) fall below a certain point, it's termed anemia. This disrupts the nutrient supply to the follicle, affecting the hair growth cycle and

may result in shedding. Food sources: Animal products such as Chicken and Fish provide Iron with a high bioavailability, meaning the Iron is readily available to the body. Vegetarians can raise their Iron stores by including Lentils, Spinach and other leafy green vegetables such as Broccoli, Kale and salad greens.

3. Vitamin C

Vitamin C aids the absorption of iron so foods high in vitamin C are good to eat in conjunction with iron-rich foods. It is also an antioxidant, hence used readily by the body. Vitamin C helps in the production of collagen that strengthens the capillaries that supply the hair shafts.

4. Omega-3 fatty acids

These are important fats our body cannot make itself, and therefore must be obtained through our diet. Omega-3s are found in the cells that line the scalp and also provide the oils that keep your scalp and hair hydrated.

5. Vitamin A

Vitamin A is needed by the body to make sebum. Sebum is an oily substance created by our hair sebaceous glands and provides a natural conditioner for a healthy scalp.

6. Zinc and selenium

Scalp protection involves other important minerals notably Zinc and Selenium. A lack of Zinc can lead to hair loss and dry and flaky Scalp.

7. Vitamin E

The sun can damage our hair just like it can damage our skin so ensure you eat foods rich in vitamin E to provide protection for your hair.

8. Biotin

Biotin is a water-soluble B vitamin. Too lite biotin can cause brittle hair and may lead to hair loss.

Include biotin rich foods such as whole grains, Liver, Egg yolk, Soy flour and Yeast.

9. Vitamin D

Several studies have found that vitamin D may help activate hair growth. Enough exposure to sun can synthesize Vitamin D in body or in some cases supplementation is also recommended.

What about Supplements?

The perfect way to urge the supplements you wish for a brilliant complexion is eating a healthy, balanced diet. Multivitamins or antioxidant vitamin supplements can be recommended in case a individual isn't able to take a balance diet or has as well much exposure to pollution or smoke. As

vital because it is to eat a healthy diet, one should avoid smoking, get sufficient rest, work out regularly, and drink sufficient water.

She completed her MSc in Health Sciences (Dietetics) from the University of Pune in 2007 and when she started off her career, doing a PhD didn't even feature on the list of things she wanted to do. As Roy T. Bennett said that, "You never change your life until you step out of your comfort zone; change begins at the end of your comfort zone." Her teacher from college offered her a job as a teacher and she took to it like a fish takes to water. She was convinced that teaching was her purpose and so she started to prepare for the UGC-

NET exam to be eligible for lectureship.

In 2011, Rubina got an opportunity to work as a 'Teaching Associate' and course co-ordinator at the Symbiosis School of Biomedical Science. It was only there, when she realized that she was not able to help her students with planning and executing their research projects as she did not have any research experience herself, that she finally decided that she wanted to do a PhD.

Rubina cleared her UGC-NET exam for JRF in 2013 and, a very dear teacher and now a friend, Dr. Angeline, gave her a glowing recommendation. With this, she joined the Hirabai Cowasji Jehangir Medical Research Institute (HCJMRI) for a PhD in Health Science. The HCJMRI is affiliated with the Savitribai Phule Pune University. She defended her thesis titled "Studies in Linkages of Nutritional Status and Infections in Rural Children and Possible Role of Vitamin D and Zinc for Promoting Immunity" on October 4th, 2019. Her mother and brother were so proud and happy. She just wishes her father could have been there.



Juspina Our Research Scholar

Below are a few of the important lessons Rubina learnt (or re-learnt) through her PhD which she wishes to share with her Lila sisters who want to pursue PhD in future.

- 1. Have an attitude of gratitude! Thank God with all your heart for the privilege and opportunity for education that you have got. Thank Him for your intelligence, your family, your support system. Then thank your family and your support system. You can never have enough of expressing gratitude. It is paramount to going through your journey (PhD or life) as a grounded individual.
- 2. **Don't sweat the little things!** Things are not going to go as planned. Things are going to go wrong. You will get yelled at by your supervisor. Journal reviewers may give your article difficult reviews. Your article will get rejected. It's not the end of the world! Reach out to friends, talk it out, cry if you have to, but pick yourself up and move on. The PhD journey is a long one where it's easy and normal to feel unmotivated for certain stretches of time. We all need a little inspiration to perk us up during those days.
- 3. **Be patient!** A PhD takes at least 4 years, if not more. You need that time to get a hang of the end-to-end execution of a research project. If you try to rush through your PhD in anything less than 4 years you will not really learn much.

- 4. **Don't be lazy!** Scientific manuscript writing is a skill to be mastered. Very few are born with the innate ability to write well. The rest of us mere mortals learn manuscript writing by practicing it. And also reading other research articles. Reading lots and lots of them. Don't be lazy. The more research articles you read, the better you will be able to write.
- 5. More Time! Whenever you are asked to give a deadline of completion of a job, always ask for more time that what you think you will require. No one will fault you for completing the job early, but tardiness will reflect poorly on you.
- 6. **New Opportunity!** Plan at least a year in advance for what you will do after your thesis has been submitted. It will take you at least that much time to find a good opportunity. Make sure your LinkedIn page is up to date. Join Facebook groups for PhD scholars - they always post about new opportunities. New opportunities are also posted on Research Gate and the websites of research societies.
- 7. Finally, enjoy the journey! It is a messy, difficult, crazy journey but it is a memorable one.
