t is difficult to believe that LPF will be entering the 30th year with new hopes and aspirations. Lila though very successful in her corporate career, decided to leave and started the Foundation with the purpose of helping girls financially to complete their studies. The beginning was small. About 20 girls



were helped for their post graduate studies in India and abroad. After a few years scholarships for overseas studies were discontinued as the girls preferred to work abroad while Lila wanted them to devote their energy and efforts in nation building. India needed their expertise. In the last 29 years, the Foundation has expanded its activities many folds by offering scholarships for school education to post graduate studies in various disciplines. Every year hundreds of students receive scholarships. It is helping girls from Wardha, Amravati and Hyderabad too.

We've truly come a long way. Think about the struggles of Savitribai Phule just to start a school for girls. Now, we're witnessing a transformative shift in girls' higher education. Young women are increasingly breaking through societal norms and economic constraints, pursuing their academic aspirations with determination.

Recent reports indicate a remarkable surge in female enrollment in higher education, with All India Survey for Higher Education (AISHE, 2021) studies showing a **28% year-on-year growth**, significantly outpacing male enrollment. This upward trend reflects a growing recognition of the value of educating girls, not just for their individual empowerment but for the holistic development of families and the nation. While we appreciate this growth, data also shows that while more than 90% of girls enroll in schools, only 50% enroll for higher secondary level (UDISE data) and much lesser percentage opt for graduate and postgraduate studies.

Challenges persist. Deep-rooted cultural and social norms, financial hardships, and a lack of adequate infrastructure in some regions hinder girls' access to and completion of

higher education. This is where organizations like the Lila Poonawalla Foundation (LPF) play a crucial role.

As the new Senior GM, Operations, I am incredibly excited and eager to contribute to this vital cause and work with the pioneering foundation of India. I look forward to working closely with our dedicated team to further **strengthen our operations**, **enhance our outreach**, ensuring even more deserving girls to benefit from our programs. My focus will be on **nurturing our corporate partnerships** to create more robust scholarship and placement opportunities.

I look forward to the continued support of Lila Alumni, Lila fellows, Lila girls, Lila seniors and lila juniors to honor the opportunity they have received to learn, grow and empower themselves to become independent and responsible global citizens. Never be afraid to let your daughters dream!

am proud of my daughter. She is going to achieve every goal she sets."These were the proud words of Mrs. Ragini Pandey, mother of Aastha Pandey, Lila Girl 2024.

Like every parent, Mr. and Mrs.

Pandey dreamed of giving
their daughter the best possible future. Aastha, in turn, matched that dream with her dedication and determination to reach new heights each day. With a smile, Mrs. Pandey shares that Aastha enjoys studying so much that she often forgets to eat. "She just loses herself in her books," she says. Aastha dreams of working at a multinational company and hopes to travel the world—Japan being at the top of her wish list.

Currently in her third year of IT Engineering after completing a diploma in the same field, Aastha's aspirations once caused concern for her parents. The family went through a difficult financial phase after COVID-19, losing their main sources of income. To sustain themselves, they opened a small laundry shop. "When Aastha told us she wanted to go to Japan, we had to break her heart and tell her we couldn't afford to fulfill that dream," recalls Mrs. Pandey.



A similar dilemma arose when Aastha secured admission to the Cummins College of Engineering for Women in Pune. The cost of higher education seemed beyond their reach—until the Lila Poonawalla Foundation came into their lives. Aastha learned about the scholarship through her college professors and shared it with her family. Although unsure if she would be selected, she decided to give it a try. Mrs. Pandey recalls how nervous Aastha was

before the interview but proudly notes that she faced it with courage, later describing it as one of the most memorable moments of her life.

Mr. and Mrs. Pandey also had the opportunity to meet Lila Mom and Firoz Dad. "We were truly inspired and in awe of them," they said. "We will always be thankful—not just for supporting our daughter's education, but for empowering her in every way."

Originally from Varanasi, the Pandey family moved to Pune in search of a better future for their children. However, they still face discouragement from extended family in their village. "One relative once called and said his daughter was already married with a child, and that we should think of getting Aastha married soon too. They told us that educating her would only make it harder to find a groom and we'd have to pay a big dowry," shared Mrs. Pandey. "My husband immediately shut them down and said our daughter would never need to give dowry—her education will open doors on its own."

Things are changing, though. Mrs. Pandey proudly shares that now, when they visit their village, people

praise Aastha and even encourage their own daughters to study hard. Aastha and her family have become role models, setting an example for others and paving a new path for young girls with big dreams.

Mrs. Pandey considers the Lila Poonawalla Foundation to be a blessing. "LPF has been like a gift from God," she says. "The financial support and training programs have not only helped us educate our daughter but have shaped her into the amazing young woman she is becoming."

Mr. and Mrs. Pandey hope to one day give back to the foundation that changed their lives. Mrs. Pandey's message to other parents is simple yet powerful: "Don't let society or money stop you from letting your daughters be who they want to be." She adds, "Money may come and go, but people like Lila Mom and Firoz Dad will always be there to help. So never be afraid to let your daughters dream."

ntroduction -

Diabetes mellitus is a chronic metabolic disorder characterized by too much glucose in the blood and urine due to defective insulin action or deficiency in its secretion. Insulin, a hormone produced by the beta cells of the Islets of langerhans of the pancreas helps to utilize glucose for the production of energy



by the body. Insulin helps in glucose uptake by the cells, prevents rise in blood sugar and maintains its level Within normal limits. In diabetes, glucose does not enter body cells, but accumulates in the blood. After it reaches a certain limit, it starts appearing in urine. It draws out more water with it and hence there is excessive urination.

Prevalence -

It is generally believed that diabetes is more prevalent in affluent Societies, where obesity is a major health problem. However, it is observed that undernourished subjects are equally susceptible to diabetes. In India 2.5 percent of the population are affected with diabetes and more than 90% of all diabetics belong to the non insulin dependent type.

Common Types

There are two main types of diabetes.

- 1. Insulin dependent diabetes melitus. (Type 1)
- 2. Non-insulin dependent diabetes mellitus. (Type 2)




Insulin Dependent Diabetes (IDDM or Type - I) -

This type of diabetes usually affects children or adolescents and is known as juvenile onset diabetes. There is little or no production of insulin and as a result, such individuals require daily insulin injections. There is usually a sudden onset. The symptoms get severe, when insulin injections are discontinued. The diabetic can develop a life-threatening metabolic complication referred to as ketoacidosis.

Non-Insulin Dependent Diabetes (NIDDM or Type 2)

This usually affects overweight or obese adults and is known as adult onset diabetes. Non insulin dependent diabetes develops slowly and is usually milder and more stable. The insulin production may be normal or even high. However the insulin produced is not as effective as normal. In subjects with this type of diabetes, diet, exercise or oral anti-diabetic drugs may be enough to control the raised blood sugar levels

Some other types of Diabetes Mellitus



- 1. Malnutrition related Diabetes Mellitus Here pancreas fails to produce enough insulin
- Gestational Diabetes Mellitus (GDM) It occurs in 1% of pregnant women

Predisposing factors

- Heredity If both the parents are diabetic 99% chances
- 2. Obesity
- 3. Age over 35 years, Diabetes Mellitus is more prevalent in Men



- Lack of physical activity increases the chance of developing DM
- 5. Malnutrition It impairs the cell function
- 6. Stress Susceptible individuals are at high risk
- 7. Intake of simple sugar

Symptoms -

- 1. Polydipsia (EXCessive thirst).
- Polyphagia (Increased appetite especially for sweets).
- 3. Polyuria (frequent urination) and nocturia Itching.
- 4. Easy tiring, weakness or irritability.
- 5. Drowsiness.
- 6. Slow healing of cuts and wounds.
- 7. Frequent infections of the skin, gums and vagina and pain in the legs, feet, urinary tract
- 8. Blurred vision.
- 9. Hyperglycaemia (elevated blood sugar level)
- 10. Glucosuria

Diagnostic tests

Normal Blood sugar levels

(BSL)

BSL Fasting (Empty stomach) 100 mg/dl

BSL (Post prandial) 120 mg/dl

- 1. Blood sugar levels are key diagnostic tests
- 2. HbA1C (To the average of the last 3 months)
- 3. Urinary sugar test
- 4. Benedict's test

Objectives in the Management of Diabetes

- 1. Reduce the sugar in blood and urine.
- 2. Maintain ideal body weight.
- 3. Treat the symptoms Reduce serum lipids, Provide adequate nutrition, Avoid acute complications.
- 4. Prevent vascular complications

Diet Tips for Diabetics

- 1. No sweets / Sugar, jaggery, dried fruits in any form
- 2. No rice and rice products
- 3. No coconut water
- 4. No Bakery items

Diet Chart for Diabetic Patients





- 5. Avoid mutton
- 6. Avoid full cream milk
