If we look at the statistics, a vast majority of our girls have been placed in companies of great repute, with good positions and packages. The transformation that the LPF Girls have gone through is nothing short of remarkable. They have become more confident, fearless and focused.


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Mission

Based in Pune, LPF's main goal is to support academically clever but economically challenged girls to pursue their education. In Maharashtra where lack of literacy amongst the masses, especially the female population is an ongoing crisis, LPF's mission is to enable socially deprived and financially disadvantaged girls pursue Professional Degrees and become economically independent and confident girls, who can not only earn for themselves but also take care of their families.

Understanding that degree isn't just a means to sustain livelihood, LPF aims to work towards mentoring the scholarship awardees, which in turn will enable them to enhance their skills and get better employment opportunities.

Empowerment being the crux of the Foundation, LPF aims to empower the girls so that they become financially independent and dynamic individuals who will work alongside men whereby reshaping the traditional gender norms and bringing equality in interpersonal and social relationships, thus promoting gender equality.



Objectives of LPF



1. Promoting Education of Girls

As education is the base of a strong and successful career, it is the objective of the Foundation to promote the noble cause of Girl Child Education.

Foundation gives an outright grant to girls, who have an outstanding academic record but belong to a financially challenged background, to pursue graduation or postgraduation. This support encourages them to pursue education further and also complete it successfully.

2. Personality Development & Empowerment of Girls

Besides financial support for education, the Foundation ensures that the girls become empowered and confident, yet gentle young ladies. LPF regularly conducts many training programs for the girls.

3. Economically Independent

Education helps the girls to be employable and economically independent to support their family.

4. Promote Gender Equality

Girls become financially independent and work alongside men in different areas thus reshaping the traditional gender norms and bringing equality in interpersonal and social relationships.

• Expected Outcomes

- Higher education for academically bright girls, belonging to a financially challenged background.
- Life Skills and mentoring support to enhance employability.
- Holistic development of the girls.

• Key Performance Indicators

- Successful progression, performance and completion of the course.
- Increased self-confidence, communication, problem solving and technology skills.
- Job placement with good packages.

Monitoring & Evaluation

- Usage of Goodera platform for conducting baseline, end line and program lifecycle management.
- Deployed mobile app-based reporting system for girls about their academic performance, extracurricular achievements and engaging with the Foundation.
- Developed a cloud-based Monitoring and Evaluation system with customized dashboards for analytics.
- Creation of a system to capture and analyze pre and post training feedback from the girls.

History of Lila Poonawalla Foundation

Started in the Year 1996, the Lila Poonawalla Foundation (LPF) continues to grow with each passing year. Prominent educationists and professionals from Pune form a highly motivated team of Trustees LPF, a registered Charitable Trust (October 9, 1995), incorporated under the provision of Bombay Public Charitable Trust Act 1950 bearing Reg. No. E 2133 (Pune). Since its inception, LPF has worked hard towards its cause of 'Women Empowerment through merit-cum-need based Scholarships and Employability readiness'.

The Foundation provides scholarships to academically outstanding and financially deserving girls to complete their education. LPF also equips them with employability training, counseling, mentoring, internships and placements which enable them to get respectable employment, thus making them and their families financially independent. This also helps them to grow into empowered, confident and socially aware individuals.

LPF started its journey in 1996 with scholarships for Post Graduate studies. In its 15th year, LPF started the Undergraduation scholarships and in the following year, i.e. 16th year, LPF took a big step forward with school scholarships under the '2morrow2gether' Project. In the 19th year, the Foundation took another bold step by expanding beyond the district of Pune and ventured into to the drought prone cities of Amravati, Nagpur and Wardha. The idea behind this expansion was to give the academically brilliant girls, who face adverse conditions, a chance to achieve their dreams.

So far, over 23000+ scholarships have been granted to 8300+ deserving girls, including 1800+ girls who are supported from 7th grade, right up to their graduation. In FY18-19, 65% of girls got placed, 15% pursued higher education and the rest wait for the appropriate opportunities.

Many renowned Corporate and Philanthropic Foundations have been partnering with LPF. This partnership has resulted in achieving their CSR Goals of Women Empowerment, Diversity and Inclusion, Education and Employability. We assume great accountability for achieving project outcome and impact and ensure complete transparency with our partners through impact reporting and fund utilization reports. We stay connected with them through leadership meets, employee volunteering activities and internships/ placements for LPF scholars.

LPF Alumni play a very important role in giving back through conducting training programs, being a part of the scholarship selection committee, mentoring LPF scholars and providing monetary assistance through donations to LPF.

Success stories of 8300+ girls speak about the universal, sustainable and multiplying impact that Lila Poonawalla Foundation has been enabling since the past 24 years.

School Project- '2morrow 2gether'

Lila Poonawalla Foundation (LPF) took a brave step to support girls' education at an early stage i.e. school level through its project aptly christened, '2morrow 2gether'. This project aims at increasing access to quality school education for the girls from financially challenged families through merit-cum-need based scholarships and employability readiness in Pune – rural & urban areas. The project started in 2011 with 4 schools from urban areas and 1 from rural area. In this project, LPF provides scholarships from 7th grade through High School (10+2) and Undergraduation courses (3 or 4 years). The LPF scholarship is 'Comprehensive and Holistic'. In addition to the financial support, LPF provides counseling to girls and their parents and mentoring sessions which include grooming and career guidance. A total of 19 (non-aided or partially aided) schools are supported by LPF, 9 of those schools are in the rural parts of Pune district. LPF has supported a total of 1300+ urban and 500+ rural school girls till date.

Selection Criteria of Schools:

Identification of Schools: Identify the schools as per the set criteria from rural and urban areas of Pune district, where girls from economically deprived families are studying.

Detailed Study: Conduct systematic survey of schools, consisting of meeting with school administration, explaining them the benefit of the project, importance of their role, partnership scope and invite them to participate in the same.

Scope for Survey: Teaching staff, number of girls and boys, medium of teaching, infrastructure – library, laboratory, playground, recreation hall, drinking water facilities, computer lab, toilet facilities, etc.

Selection Criteria of Girls:

Select the eligible girls as per the eligibility criteria (i.e. need and merit) call for applications along with relevant documents related to academics and financial status from the eligible candidates of 7th grade.

- Conduct the entrance test for applied candidates.
- Conduct interviews of all the girls along with their parents- by an expert LPF committee.
- Evaluate candidates on set parameters and take a unanimous decision.
- Administer MoU with selected schools and parents for the final selected candidates.

Scholarship Support:

Provide financial aid through scholarships, subject to required academic performance criteria. Scholarship is given towards the partial tuition fees, examination fees and computer class fees, as applicable. A fixed amount is allocated to each girl for her uniform, shoes, books, sweaters, raincoats, school bags etc.

Scholarships for 10th and 12th grades/ Diploma programs and for the undergraduate programs consist of partial tuition fees, hostel fees if applicable, commute/ travel fees, coaching classes' fees as applicable.

Once an awardee is selected for scholarship in 7th grade, she is known as a LILA Junior (LJ) up to her 10th grade. This Scholarship continues through 11th and 12th standard or Diploma in Engineering, during which she is known as a LILA Senior (LS). During her graduation, she is known as a LILA Girl (LG).




Scholarship Awarded

The 8th school scholarship function was held on 7th July, 2018 at Cummins India, Baner, Pune. A total of 306 LILA Juniors were awarded the scholarship on the same day. LILA Fellows - Ms. Sarika Deore and Ms. Ruta Limaye were Chief Guests and Ms. Shivani Naik was the Guest of Honor for this function.







Skill Development, Training & Counseling

Skill development & Training: Training strengthens confidence and improves skills. Beyond scholarships, LPF conducts training and development workshops for LILA Juniors and LILA Seniors, which includes academic skills workshops Computers, Science and Maths enhancement, , spoken English, personality development, etiquettes and mannerism, awareness of good health and hygiene, self-defense, stress management, confidence building, career guidance as well as extra coaching sessions for academically weak girls. Employability skills training is provided to the girls during their under graduation course.



Science Camp

Counseling Program: Counselors monitor the progress of the girls through individual interaction, various counseling programs and mentor academically weak girls and their parents. This program includes individual counseling, group counseling, need based parents' counseling, home visits and interactions with school teachers and principals.

Orientation Program: In this program, new scholarship recipients are introduced to overall functioning of LPF which includes scholarship reimbursement process, information about training programs, communication requirements with LPF and progress report updating requirements.

Undergraduate & Postgraduate Project

The girls are supported with a grant scholarship for completing their Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) studies in various fields, for the entire period of the course. The girls who are academically outstanding, but have economic constraints are selected. The criteria for selection are well defined and only deserving girls are selected after being interviewed by an expert panel.

To get impeccable results, the micro planning and implementation plan is exercised by the Board of Trustees, Selection Committee members and LPF team. LPF follows a detailed selection process.

For encouraging truly deserving applications, LPF has come up with an 'Online Application Portal' in year 2018-19. This user friendly and time efficient software helps to increase transparency and accuracy of the selection process.

April-May

• Project Planning: Planning of the eligibility criteria- need and merit based (family income level and academic marks).

June-July

• **Promotion and Communication:** LPF creates awareness about scholarship and promotes the project through posters, e-mails, news papers and social media.

July-August • Application: Interested candidates fill the application form online & submit the required documents for verification in the LPF office.

Sept -Nov

•Selection: Evaluation of applications through customized software and personal interview, conducted by a qualified panel.


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
- •Felecitation of Scholarship: Felicitatating selected scholarship awardees with scholarship certificate.
- •Orientation Program: Introduce scholarship reimbursement process & varied training programs, communication with LPF.

Every eligible application form is evaluated thoroughly with the use of specially designed software, followed by personal interviews with a qualified panel and selection of those girls who would benefit the most.


Those girls who get the scholarship for completing their Post-graduation course are known as 'LILA Fellows (LF)' and the girls who are getting scholarship for Under graduation course are known as 'LILA Girls (LG)'.


In 2018-2019, LPF has supported undergraduate courses like – Bachelor of Engineering, Engineering after Diploma, Science, Pharmacy and Nursing in Pune. LPF has also supported Bachelor of Engineering, Engineering after Diploma, Pharmacy, Agriculture and Nursing in Wardha, Amravati and Nagpur (WAN). For the Post-graduation course in Pune, all streams are supported except Medical.






Course Wise Comparative Analysis



Orientation Program for UG/PG Scholarship Recipients

After the Scholarship Award Function where girls are felicitated with scholarship certificate, LPF arranges an 'Orientation Program' –an informal program for awardees. In this program, new scholarship recipients are introduced to overall functioning of LPF which includes scholarship reimbursement process, information about training programs, communication requirements with LPF and progress report updating requirements.

Some of the LPF Alumni also join the session and share their experiences. Mrs. Lila Poonawalla, Chairperson and Mr. Firoz Poonawalla, Founder Trustee of LPF also shared their expectations and their success stories with these girls.





Overview of Skills Development & Training Workshops

Training programs assist the girls in their overall development. In addition to soft skills, the girls also get an industrial exposure, wherein they get to know about the working environment of the company. The training programs are divided into 7 spectrums namely Self Defense, English Class, Career Guidance, Industrial Visit, Soft Skills, Health Awareness and Technical workshops.

Skills Development Workshops

The main goal of these workshops is to introduce and develop life skills, corporate readiness, leading to their personal and professional learning and growth. Skill development workshops and mentoring enable these girls to channelize them for suitable job opportunities. For this reason LPF organizes programs like Time Management, Winning with Body Language, Mind Mapping, Attitude Building and Presentation Skills for their overall development.

Programs like Success Keys for Cracking Interviews, Corporate Readiness, Group Discussion and Interview Skills guide the girls on how to crack the interviews at every round of the interview process. Such programs are beneficial to girls when they are at the peak point of their career. The ultimate goal is to support girls to realize their full potential, making them employable to pursue their dream career.

Self Defense Workshop



Every girl and every woman today needs to defend her honour and herself. The objectives on which the workshop focused upon included, preparation for SWOT analysis, effective application of self-defence techniques, fitness and conditioning exercises for surviving the act of atrocity and much more. The workshop proved particularly beneficial for the girls, as now they can impart and demonstrate the importance and the efficiencies of the Self Defense.

Industry Exposure

Industry exposure visits to companies like Volkswagen, Sandvik, Seco Tools, Cummins etc. helped LILA Girls to gain industry knowledge and how organization functions. Visit to Gowardhan Dairy and IISER gave girls experience of functioning of the shop floor. Pharmaceutical companies like Lupin and Emcure helped adding value in their knowledge. Visit to Bel Air College of Nursing, Panchgani is organized for Nursing girls.

Industrial Visit to Volkswagen

Lupin Limited volunteers conducts Industrial visit for LILA girls studying 3rd year Pharmacy. LILA girls get exposure to the different departments like Research and Development labs. Volunteers also give information about Anti-TB, Cephalosporin (anti-infective) and cardiovascular drugs (ACE-inhibitors and cholesterol reducing agents) anti-inflammatory and respiratory therapy.






PUNE- Course wise Placement Details (in %)

Peace Ambassador (PA) - Leadership Development Program

The Peace Ambassadors Program commenced in 2008 promoted by the Lila Poonawalla Foundation and so far around 142 LILA girls and LILA Fellows have been trained in the Asha Centre (British Educational Charity, located in the forest of Dean in Gloucestershire, UK.) The purpose of this program is to empower LILA Girls to become guide other girls and the community. It aims to provide LILA Girls the skills and insight to develop their passion, commitment and resilience in life and make a positive difference in their community. The duration of the program is three weeks and it intends to help LILA Girls & LILA Fellows develop holistically and they are groomed on:

- Leadership what it is and what leaders do
- Change how it happens
- Resilience staying fit to lead
- Getting things done people and projects.
- Great communication how to do it
- Team work how to lead and how to follow
- Decision making ethical and sustainable
- Empathy- conscious to others needs and pains

The girls are selected as per the selection procedure comprising of initial screening criteria and pre-selection questionnaire. Those who are in communication with the Foundation, actively volunteering and participating in the LPF Events and Training Programs are considered. Post the initial screening, applications of the LILA Girls and LILA Fellows are screened by the Chairperson and Founder Trustee and then only 24 candidates are selected to be the Peace Ambassadors.

LPF intended to deliver transformative and holistic education to LILA girls and LILA Fellows by nurturing abilities to appreciate the spiritual & philosophical wisdom of the world's cultures and inculcating connectedness with the communities and the environment.

Dwelling upon intercultural appreciation, communication, presentation and negotiation skills and stress management, the Peace Ambassadors training program also includes various visits to Oxford University, London eye, Madame Tussauds Wax museum, Buckingham Palace and British Museum. Peace Ambassadors get an opportunity to engage with a center for people with learning disabilities and special needs and are trained in Lucca Leadership techniques that combine interactive as well as activity driven participation, Yoga and Stress Management, Posture and presentation skills etc.

Interschool Quiz Competition:




