

School Project - '2Morrow - 2Gether'


(Scholarship, Counseling, Skill Building & Infrastructure Support)

The new batch of LILA Juniors, who come from economically disadvantaged families were awarded the scholarship from the age 12, i.e. from 7th grade right up to her graduation. Through this project, these girls are supported with relevant skill building and training initiatives that will help them in enhancing their knowledge, functional, technical and corporate ready skills. The school project is divided in 3 phases - LILA Juniors - Phase I (7th grade - 10th grade), LILA Seniors - Phase 2 (11th grade - 12th grade) and LILA Girls - Phase 3 (Undergraduation).

Beyond Scholarship




Some of the Essential Skills and Training Programs like Winning with Body Language, Health Awareness, Emotional Excellence, Time Management and English Communications were organized.





Campus Readiness and Employability Skills



Placement

Our girls who have completed Postgraduation and Undergraduation have been placed in reputed companies such as Accenture, Bosch, BYJU's, Concentrix, Infosys, Lupin, SKODA Auto Volkswagen (SAVIPL), TCS and medical institutions Breach Candy, Jupiter Hospital and Ruby Hall Clinic with a package of INR 2.5 to 22 Lacs P.A. Some of our corporate partners like SAVIPL have offered internship and placement opportunities to our girls.

From My Heart...

My dear Daughters, Friends and Well Wishers,

In last 6 months, almost every person's life has become tippy-turvy. COVID-19 Virus, now known as COVID-19 has brought upheaval in every walk of life. Economy is stressed. All companies, establishments and businesses have taken a great knock. Education has suffered and still remains a dilemma for all students and teachers equally. Over 10 million people left their jobs and migrated back to their homes. All the planes are grounded, restaurants are closed, all services have come to almost a standstill. Only businesses like oil, trains, which are run by the government may have had less impact, but positively they also have suffered. Banking system is severely affected. With all this we are trying our level best to ensure that our Foundation is holding strong. We have kept going. Many of the staff worked from home and we continue to pay salaries not only to our staff but also to our service providers. How long this will continue is anybody's guess. We request the entire LPF family to keep on praying so that some normalcy returns at the earliest.

Obviously we all have to change our ways of work. To start with all our training and skill development programs have gone on line. In this period of 4 months April to July we have conducted more than 80 programs on line covering various subject matters. To name a few, Scale up, Graduate Leadership Program, Catalyze, Six Sigma, Emotional Excellence, Stress Management, Effective utilization of Preparation Leave, Personality Development, Attitude Building, mentor together, Skillmini App, Including Artificial Intelligence, block chain, Data analytics, financial management and many such other relevant subjects. What is interesting that even English courses have been conducted on line for our school children too. We are indeed obliged to the trainers who very quickly changed over to adopt the new methods, and also our Partners who came forward to pool in their resources to reach out to too many more girls covering many relevant topics. Even our Alumni has come forward to participate in this challenge. We have thus come to the conclusion that all programs will be conducted on line as these have turned out to be more effective and also participation has increased by leaps and bounds.

This is our Foundation's 25th year. We had many plans to celebrate this special milestone in the life of our beloved Foundation and also an important phase in the life of Dad and me. But at present that seems a bit difficult. We will wait and watch. In the meantime, we will do whatever is possible on line. We are even planning to do the entire scholarship process on line. We have already started to receive the claims on line. That is working quite smoothly. Besides applications submissions, we have also decided to do the selection interviews on line. It is surely going to be very exciting to do all this in a new way. Turning over a new page, applying new technologies, in the 25th year of our existence.

You all must have read various communications through our Foundation Social media about the work the foundation is doing for supporting the COVID affected people. Both helping our own girls and wherever possible even others, with, monthly rations. Dad was personally monitoring this project and was present at every distribution site. Of course, he took all the precautions that were required. More details in this issue in a separate article.

Now to create better awareness about COVID-19 and precautionary measures around it, Dad has decided to orient all our girls on this subject on line, in batches.

From My Heart...

Dear Daughters,

2020 was quite a year! It was an unprecedented year but we made it through. We all hit the reset button and paused. What a gift. We dug deep. Prioritized. Found hidden talents. Reconnected. Learned a lot and did whatever it takes to make things possible. Air quality improved. Wildlife roamed free. Virtual life soared. Amazing how the whole year has evaporated is just unbelievable.

This was a year for CELEBRATION for our Foundation. SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATION. Crossing the 25th year Milestone is not something that can be ignored. 25 years of hard work, commitment, dedication all rolled into one to succeed in growing from 20 girls to 9000 plus girls. This is a great milestone in our life. We had planned many events to ensure that this year remains etched in our memory for ever. It is true that this year will remain etched in our memories for ever, but for different reasons. Everything that we had planned for our beloved Foundation went for a toss. How at the same time this one year has evaporated we do not know. Nothing worked as per the plans.

To start with the existing scholarship recipients, could not have exams. So, no results. They could not come for claims. Budgets were disrupted. No training programs, no face-to-face interactions. Selection process for new batch for academic year 2020-2021 could not happen as there were no admission, no exams. Further confusion as the government kept changing the dates. This led to a lot of confusion and stress both for students as also for us. There was continuous rescheduling of dates for application submission, interview schedules, award functions, orientation programs, training programs, all got disrupted and had to be rescheduled not once but many times to suit the Covid 19 virus. Nobody is to be blamed, but the students have gone through a tough time. Even presently it is not clear how things will turn out. Will school/colleges open soon? Will exams take place as scheduled? Will new admissions for academic year 21-22 take place in time, so we can move on to some regularity in our work? All a BIG QUESTION MARK. All we can say is wait and watch. The learning cycle from all this is one. That nothing is inevitable nor what we claim as important is found to be that we can do without it. At present we are learning how to keep ourselves alive. Churches, temples, mosques all are closed (All worship). We find that GOD exists in our hearts and in our HOME. We pray at home. We do not have to build a palace in God's name to pray. Social distance has become the order of the day. We need not give birthday parties, and go to restaurants. We don't even have to meet our relatives and friends. No big weddings. Travelling is tabooed. We do not go to office to work, but WFH. All meetings are zoom, team links or such platforms. And the best discovery is that we still are able to work reasonably effectively. In fact, some of the functions are performed better on line.

But one thing is still valid and more so now, and that is empathy. In our Foundation we have learned that we have to support needy and underprivileged people. So many of our citizens had very little to eat for a nutritious meal so that their immunity increases and they can fight Virus and diseases. many of us were dislodged from the comfort of our job and homes. Many of us were separated from our families and friends. However, the best discovery is that we still are able to work reasonably effectively, maintain relations, appreciate the value of friendships. In fact, some of the functions are performed better on line, like training programs.


