As part of its phase-wise scholarship awarding process, the LPF has awarded scholarships to **290** deserving girls currently studying in 7th grade, 11th grade, and graduation.

The School Project is operational in over 13 schools across Pune city and its rural surroundings. The girls supported through this initiative come from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

LPF also extends counseling sessions for both the girls and their parents, aiming to enhance their emotional well-being & personal growth. The foundation contributes to the holistic development of schools by supporting essential infrastructure improvements such as building clean and safe washrooms, constructing multipurpose halls, and establishing computer labs and dedicated play areas.

LPF places strong emphasis on creating school environments that are thoughtfully painted and designed to be vibrant, inclusive & welcoming, fostering both digital literacy and the physical well-being of young students.
